



#1 Randolph-Macon Yellow Jackets

Yellow Jacket Notes

▶▶ Leading Randolph-Macon this season is junior forward Justin Wansley, at 18.6 points and 10.2 rebounds per game. He has been the team's top scorer in 15 games and has led the Yellow Jackets in rebounding 18 times. His career-highs have included 33 points at Eastern Mennonite in December and 18 rebounds against Lynchburg, also in December. Wansley scored his 1,000th career point at Virginia Wesleyan in mid-January. A preseason All-American according to the D3hoops.com website, he was named the ODAC Player of the Week once and to the D3hoops.com Team of the Week once this year.

▶▶ Sophomore forward Philip Hawley is arguably Randolph-Macon's most improved player this season. He is second on the team in scoring (14.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg), and leads the team in blocked shots (30 total) and field goal percentage (146-for-212 — 68.9%). Hawley has led R-MC in scoring in three games and in rebounding seven times.

▶▶ Senior point guard Justin Moyer has been a leader both on and off the court this year. In addition, Moyer leads R-MC in assists, with 105 (4.4 apg). Career-highs for Moyer this year have included 19 points against Emory & Henry, 10 assists against Washington and Lee in December, and seven rebounds at Eastern Mennonite.

▶▶ Junior guard Patrick Gill checks in at 9.6 points and 3.3 assists per contest. He is one of the best long-range shooters on the team, connecting on 52-of-127 (40.0%) three-pointers this season. Gill has also made 88.9% (16-for-18) of his free throw attempts. His season-high of 23 points led all scorers in a win at Hampden-Sydney last weekend. Career-highs for Gill this year have included 12 assists against Emory & Henry and seven rebounds at Virginia Union.

▶▶ Sophomore guard Adam Krovic comes off the bench to average 8.2 points per game. He is currently shooting 84.1% (58-for-69) at the foul line. Krovic had career-highs of 25 points and six assists against Emory & Henry, and led all scorers with 18 points at Guilford in January.

▶▶ Key contributors off the bench have included sophomore guard Stephen Sutherland, freshman center Andrew Baker, and freshman forward Jeremy Dixon. Sutherland just scored a career-high 14 points at Bridgewater this past Tuesday, making four three-pointers. Baker has scored 13 points twice this season, and pulled down 12 rebounds against Guilford. Dixon was slowed by illness for several games, but has still made an impact. He totaled 12 points and 10 rebounds in 16 minutes.

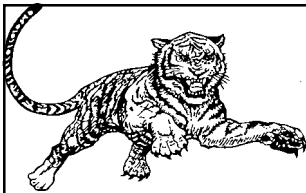
#3 Bridgewater Eagles

Eagle Notes

- » Bridgewater College head coach enters the 2005 ODAC tournament with a 303-215 overall record. Leatherman posted his 300th career victory earlier this season when the Eagles defeated Eastern Mennonite, 80-75, on January 22.
- » This year's senior class has posted a 56-42 record at Bridgewater, a .571 winning percentage.
- » Ricky Easterling is the second Bridgewater College player to be named All-ODAC first team for three straight years. Kyle Williford earned the honor in 2000, 2001 and 2002.
- » The Eagles are looking to get past the first round in the tournament for the first time since 2001. The Eagles have lost in the opening round in each of the past three seasons. BC's last first-round victory came in 2001 when the Eagles defeated Virginia Wesleyan, 82-68.
- » The Eagles last played in the ODAC championship game in 1996 when they lost to Roanoke College 74-72

#4 Hampden-Sydney Tigers

Tiger Notes

» The Tigers will be the fourth seed for just the second time since the ODAC Tournament evolved in 1977. In their last performance as a No. 4 seed, in 1996, the Tigers defeated Virginia Wesleyan, 80-68, in the quarterfinals before falling to Roanoke, 77-73, in the semifinals.

» Hampden-Sydney has advanced to eight straight ODAC Tournament Championship games, dating back to 1997 and has won six titles in that span and nine conference championships overall.

» Saturday's meeting will be the 12th all-time between the Tigers and Maroons in the ODAC Tournament and will be the second straight year and fourth time overall the two ODAC Titans have met in the quarterfinals. Hampden-Sydney, which has won six of the previous 11 meetings including last year's 88-72 quarterfinal decision, and Roanoke have combined to win 19 ODAC titles in the 28 year history of ODAC basketball.

» Hampden-Sydney enters the 2005 tournament with a 40-17 (.702) overall tournament record during the 27 seasons it has been involved with the conference. Hampden-Sydney has never failed to make an ODAC Men's Basketball Tournament.

» Hampden-Sydney is 19-6 (.704) all-time in quarterfinal games, 12-8 (.600) in semifinal matchups and 9-3 (.750) in the big show.

» The last time the Tigers were seeded lower than third was in 1997 when four teams tied for second place in the league at 12-6 in conference play. The Tigers drew the No. 5 seed after the tie-break and went on to win the ODAC Championship after victories over Randolph-Macon (85-66), Roanoke (63-62) and Lynchburg (102-70).

» Two No. 4 seeds have won the ODAC Championship as Washington and Lee defeated Hampden-Sydney, 58-56, for the title in 1980, while Virginia Wesleyan downed Roanoke, 70-61, in the 1993 championship game.

» Hampden-Sydney has eight second-half come-from-behind victories this season, amounting for exactly half of the Tigers' 16 wins. Hampden-Sydney has come back from second-half deficits to defeat Clarke (72-64), Ferrum (75-68), Longwood (73-67), Roanoke (59-53), Guilford twice in overtime (83-78/81-78), Washington and Lee (81-75) and Lynchburg (67-55).

#5 Roanoke Maroons

Maroon Notes

▶▶ The Maroons are 12-5 since the beginning of January and in that time have shot 46 percent from the field and are outscoring opponents by an average of three points a game. That record includes nine conference wins. The Maroons started their season 3-5 overall and 0-4 in the ODAC, but opened the second half of the season with five consecutive wins, a streak they matched in late January/early February.

▶▶ Junior guard Jared Butler is averaging 12.3 points per game and is shooting just over 40 percent from the field, including 33 percent from three-point range. However, since the beginning of January he is averaging 13.7 points contest, is making 45 percent of his shots, 38 percent of his three-point attempts.

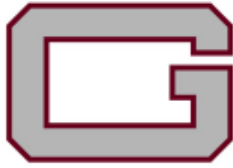
▶▶ Senior Kevinn Hunter is shooting 60.8 percent from the field this season and enters the tournament with a .601 career field goal shooting percentage. That number is on pace to break the college's all-time FG% mark of .595, which is currently held by Kenny Belton '81.

▶▶ Freshman Josh LaPorte enters the weekend's tournament ranked in the league's top-10 in five different statistical categories. He is the only freshman in the league to make such a claim. The Staunton, VA native ranks second in blocked shots, third in steals, fourth in rebounds, fourth in defensive rebounds, and ninth in assists. He is also the only ODAC rookie to rank in the top-15 in six different columns. He rates 12th in offensive rebounds.

▶▶ The Maroons are 42-14 all-time in the ODAC tournament and have won a league-record 10 conference titles. The team has played in 12 championship games and has won its first round game 20 times. The team's last title came in 2000. The Maroons were eliminated from the tournament in the first round last season and enter this weekend's tournament looking to avoid back-to-back quarterfinal exits for the first time since 1991 and 1992.

#6 Guilford Quakers

Quaker Notes

▶ After a six-year absence, Guilford is making its fifth straight ODAC Tournament appearance. The Quakers reached last season's tourney as the fifth seed and fell to fourth-seeded Virginia Wesleyan, 89-86, in the quarterfinals. Guilford owns a 1-8 record in seven ODAC Tournament appearances. The Quakers recorded their lone tournament win over Hampden-Sydney in the 1994 ODAC Quarterfinals, 89-77.

▶ The Quakers regularly play as many as 12 players per game. Among the 10 players averaging at least 13 minutes per game, Jordan Snipes leads the team with 21.1 minutes per game. As a result of the team's depth, the Quakers' bench has outscored its counterparts by 17.8 points per game this season. Guilford's second-leading scorer, Kerry Atkinson (13.0 ppg), has started only one game this season.

▶ With only one senior on the team this year (Ashford Gray), the league's coaches tabbed Guilford 9th of 11 teams in their preseason coaches poll. With a roster comprised of eight freshmen, three sophomores, two juniors and one senior, it is reasonable to expect most of this year's club will return in 2005-06. Only junior Genaro Lawhorn played regularly on Guilford's 2003-04 unit.

▶ Guilford loves basketball so much, the Quakers have played five overtime games this season, all against ODAC opponents. Guilford has a 2-3 record in overtime games this season. Among the 20 contests completed in regulation, Guilford nearly played an extra period in five of those games as they were decided by five points or less.

▶ Guilford enters the ODAC Tournament as the league leader in points per game (80.4). The Quakers are on pace to break the school's Division III scoring average record of 79.0 set by the 1994-95 club. The overall school record of 91.9 points per game was set by the 1975-76 club that competed in the NAIA ranks. Despite leading the league in scoring, only Genaro Lawhorn (13.2 ppg) and Kerry Atkinson (13.0 ppg) average more than 10 points per game, a testament to the team's deep bench and balanced style.

#7 Eastern Mennonite Royals

Royal Notes

▶▶ The 2004-05 ODAC Tournament marks EMU's first appearance in the post-season tournament since the 2000-01 team went 9-16 overall and 7-11 in conference games.

▶▶ At 12-12 overall and 8-10 in the ODAC, EMU has its most wins in a season since the 1998-99 team went 13-12 overall and 8-8 in the ODAC. The 1997-98 team had the most wins in school history at 16-9 overall and 11-7 in the ODAC.

▶▶ EMU is 4-19 all-time in the ODAC Tournament and has not won a game in the tournament since the 1982-83 team led by Leonard Dow fell to Randolph-Macon 77-70 in the championship game. The Royals are 0-14 in the tournament since 1983. EMU has had several close calls, including an 89-88 overtime loss to Virginia Wesleyan in the quarterfinals in the 1997-98 season.

▶▶ Sophomore forward Jason Sager averaged a double-double this season with 19.5 points per game and 10.1 rebounds per game. He recorded 14 double-doubles in 24 games and led the Royals in scoring 15 times. He scored a career-high of 32 points in an 82-78 win over Hampden-Sydney at home on January 10. He is currently second in the ODAC in scoring, first in rebounding, seventh in field goal percentage, and 12th in free throw percentage.

▶▶ Sager is the 12th First Team All-Conference selection in program history for the Royals. That includes Leonard Dow who earned four of the 12 selections from 1983-1986.

▶▶ Two freshmen have had breakout seasons for the Royals in 2004-05. Brad Parkes has started every game (21) since senior E.J. Arrington suffered a season-ending injury. Parkes responded by averaging 14.5 points per game, second highest on the team and sixth in the ODAC. He is sixth in field goal percentage and 15th in free throw percentage. Fellow freshman Korey Whiting has averaged 11.1 points per game, good for 19th in the conference. He is also 20th in rebounding with 4.1 per game and fifth in steals at 45.

#8 Lynchburg Hornets

Hornet Notes

- ▶ Senior Ryan Pehanick is currently ranked 10th all-time on the Lynchburg College scoring list, boasting 1,182 total points.
- ▶ The Hornets have steadily improved each of the past four seasons. They have gone from two wins in '01-'02, to six in '02-'03, nine last season, and now 11 entering the ODAC Tournament this season.
- ▶ The 2004-2005 Hornets swept the season series from Guilford College for the first time since '96-'97.
- ▶ Junior guard Andy Albright is already second on the all-time steals mark at Lynchburg College. Entering the ODAC Tourney, he has 199 steals on his career, only 11 behind LC theft leader Chris Whelan '00.
- ▶ Third in the ODAC in turnover margin, while being one of only four ODAC schools that is causing more turnovers than they commit.
- ▶ Defeated Randolph-Macon in the 2003-04 ODAC Tournament 54-50, the first time in ODAC history a #1 seed fell in the opening round.
